


THE CORE four


These are the four goals that directly stem from Equity and Opportunity for all



Guiding questions act as a framework to ensure that a policy is not only well-designed but also effective, measurable, and responsive to the needs of the children, families, and educators of Skagit County.

In other words, these questions can help us create an acountable and reliable method for us to remain loyal to a Skagit-based Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Mission. At the very least these questions may help guide us to create effective measurement practices.

INCLUSIVITY

- How are we actively embracing and celebrating the diversity of children and families in our community? What specific actions and measurables are we taking to ensure our programs and practices embrace the varied cultural, linguistic, and social backgrounds of families?
- How do we ensure that our early childhood programs are inclusive, welcoming, and respectful of the different cultural, racial, and socioeconomic backgrounds represented in our community?
- Are there any children, families, or communities that we may unintentionally be overlooking in our services? How can we identify and address these gaps to ensure no family is left out?

EQUAL ACCESS

- What barriers to accessing our early childhood programs and services have we identified? How are we working to eliminate these barriers so all families can participate?
- How do we ensure that every child and family, regardless of their background or circumstances, has equitable access to early learning resources, child care, and family support?
- In what ways do our measurables show fairness in access? What data, feedback, or family input informs our approach to improving access to early childhood services?

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- How are we engaging families from diverse backgrounds in measurable, meaningful and ongoing ways? How are we ensuring that parents and caregivers have a voice in shaping the programs and services we offer?
- How do we incorporate the perspectives and experiences of marginalized or underserved families into our decision-making and program development?
- What systems do we have in place to continuously gather input from families and caregivers? How do we respond and adapt our services based on their feedback?

CONTINUOUS LEARNING

- What steps are we taking to continually educate ourselves and our partners about equity, inclusion, and culturally responsive practices in early childhood development?
- How do we stay informed, and measure the changing needs of the families we serve, and how do we adjust our services and practices to meet these evolving needs?
- How do we remain open to feedback from families, staff, and community partners, and embrace new approaches to better serve the children and families in our care?
